The Active London Project* at Sutton Mencap, in conjunction with the Active Surrey Sports Partnership, delivered six 'All Ability' netball sessions this summer. This pilot scheme was introduced to provide adults with a learning disability and their parents and carers the opportunity to take part in netball training. Funding was secured from 'London's Summer of Sport' and coaches from Fairlands Netball Club and Cheam Ladies netball club led the sessions, alongside Tracey Hickey from Sutton MENCAP.

Due to the success of the sessions, we are now hoping to develop the project further by providing regular, ongoing sessions.

Hillcrest Summer School



Sport Unlimited, a £36 million national programme funded by Sport England, will get more children and young people taking part in sports that interest them most outside of school.



England Netball's coaching qualifications have recently been restructured to incorporate the UKCC qualifications. The Netball UKCC is about supporting 'Our Great Game' and making coaching better, supporting our players of today and tomorrow.

A Netball UKCC Level 1 course is being planned for Surrey in July / August 2009. Surrey Youth Games 2008: High-5 Event

This summer saw the introduction of a High 5 netball event into the P & G Surrey Youth Games, the largest sports competition for young people in Surrey.

Teams representing the eleven district and borough



councils of Surrey compete against each other in fourteen different sports, with events for all age groups and for young people with a disability.

High-5 Netball is the only England Netball recommended version of the game for children in school years 5 and 6 (aged 9 to 11). Nine teams entered the High-5 event this year, which was won by Surrey Heath; Spelthorne won the overall borough trophy. Young leaders from clubs across the county officiated at the event and a special mention to Rochelle Sylvester who was voted 'Official of the Games'.

The Netball Talent League creates a competitive environment in which young netballers aged from 14–19 can experience high-pressure games on a weekly basis throughout the year. England's most promising young netballers will have an opportunity to hone their



skills, as well as impress the national selectors en route to the senior game with the creation of this new elite youth competition.

The league, which is due to start at the end of October 2008, will feature 10 regionally based teams of young netballing stars. Each team will play nine matches during the season.
