# Chairman's AGM Report 2020/21 Season



It is an understatement to say what a strange season this has been as we have been in one form of covid lockdown or another during its entire period. Some limited activity has been able to take place when restrictions have permitted, and clubs have been diligently complying with England Netball's framework to

ensure all participants have been safe. But it has not been the same and we are all desperate for normal netball activity to resume and being able to see everyone in our netball community again. As I am writing this, we are awaiting the Government's announcement about whether all covid-restrictions are finally lifted. If this is the case, our AGM will be held in person which I very much hope will be the case. Last season's AGM was postponed from June 2020 to November 2020 and took place virtually via zoom. Although it was an unusual occurrence, we have all become accustomed to virtual meetings and the AGM was able to celebrate successes of Surrey netballers at the Regional Goalden Globes awards. One of the sad things about the lockdown is that we are not able to run our usual Surrey Lions awards to celebrate the success and achievement of coaches and officials, young volunteers, school and club achievements. However, we do want to acknowledge and thank as many as possible of those volunteers at grass roots level who have been working tirelessly to enable their club and players to take part in netball activity. But we need clubs to tell us about these wonderful people. We are particularly thinking of people who volunteered to be covid officers for clubs and leagues, as they have played a crucial role during this period, and having to cope with continuous information from England Netball and a mountain of guidance and information requirements placed on clubs. Of course, there will be other people in clubs and leagues who have arranged fitness sessions, and other ways of maintaining interest in netball in Surrey who we will also want to congratulate. Kath Mansfield has taken on the role of county Volunteer representative and with Carol McGrail is encouraging clubs and leagues to nominate the volunteers so we can recognise them. I would like to thank everyone who retained their membership of EN and SCNA which has helped our national governing body maintain their offer to the netball community, and also the netball development officers. So it is timely for me to thank Lottie Sudell who has been our Surrey NDO for a few years now, who has decided to move on to pastures new. It has been a pleasure to get to know Lottie who has been so helpful and supportive to the County committee and clubs and leagues particularly this last season. Lottie, we wish you all the very best for your future. I am pleased to confirm that EN will be continuing the role and is in the process of recruitment.

During the course of the last twelve months, we have let you know that much loved and respected members of our Surrey county netball community have passed away, Doreen Allen and Eileen Brewer. I am also sad to advise that June Garman sadly passed away earlier this year. Many of you would have known June from her stalwart support of county teams in the past when Surrey was riding high in the national standings, and also her dedication to Hirondelles Netball Club, which sadly had its demise not long after June stepped down from the club. June was also so encouraging to people wanting to start volunteering. I am also sad to think there are likely to be other members of our netball community who have passed away this season, and I wish their families and friends all our condolences.

We have been having county committee meetings by zoom during this period and hearing about how the leagues and schools have been trying to operate in very difficult circumstances. Information has been passed up to the London and South East Regional Board so that they are aware of issues experienced, and we have received excellent guidance and support from the Board. However, there have been successes despite the pandemic. The SCNA committee have recently congratulated our Academy Administrative lead, Patricia Balcombe, and her team of coaches, for arranging and delivering an excellent programme for the young players on the talent pathway; players and parents have followed the very stringent requirements put in place and coaches have done brilliantly. We are now in a position to look forward to the U15 tournament in the summer for local counties to enable the franchises to undertake their selection for the School Games in September, and for players to be selected into franchise academies. We wish every player across the counties good luck.

The committee have been advised that EN have introduced changes to the learning programme for umpires during the season, and EN has taken over the responsibility for arranging and delivering umpire education. Jackie Penney is working closely with EN on new innovations. Certainly, the feedback we have heard is that the online learning has been well received and is very accessible for people. However, the ease of access to these sessions makes it a victim of its own success as we understand all the courses are popular and get booked very quickly and EN will need to arrange more. Of concern to the County committee is the remaining remit for counties to manage the practical aspects of the courses and assessments, and how the communications between EN (through Engage?) and counties will work, so that the County knows who has attended the online courses. Please bear with us during this period of transition to the new arrangements,

and Jackie Penney and her team are always seeking to ensure that as many people in Surrey can achieve their officiating qualifications.

The covid restrictions have not prevented the County Committee from continuing to pursue opportunities for new facilities for netball. We intend to recommence our County league in September 2021 at our usual venue Boxhill School, which is a high quality facility, but in the long term and to improve access to high quality facilities for a broad range of activities, we have always identified that a venue with a larger capacity is what is required. This means a larger indoor space and multiple outside courts, which Boxhill does not have. I would like to commend Natalie Swift who has been progressing possibilities on several fronts, and although there is nothing specific to report to you all now, I am confident that one day in the future, there will be a netball centre in Surrey. If you have any examples of possible locations and opportunities, please do not hesitate to get in touch with us.

The County Committee is keen to advance good practice and we will continue to review our governance procedures to ensure we maintain compliance with EN standards. I have attended several meetings hosted by EN during the season, primarily about the ongoing status of netball during the pandemic, but also a briefing on new Disciplinary Regulations. I have just checked the EN website and found they have come into effect on 1 June 2021 – complaints are now to be referred directly to EN by the relevant body. We continue our grant support scheme, and details are on our website. At the AGM in November 2020, we welcomed Claire Shapland as Communications and Publicity Secretary, and she wants to find ways of improving communications between all levels of netball in Surrey, and promote activity, so please do contact her. The AGM also agreed a new post of Equalities, Diversity and Inclusivity Officer and please do consider nominating someone for this role. The details will be made available on the SCNA website.

The London and South East Regional Board will be considering a new forward plan and you can be reassured that those of us who attend regional meetings will represent our members. We will need to produce our own plan in due course. The committee want to ensure the framework for netball in Surrey is fit for purpose and provides opportunities for as many age groups and types of netball as we can, and we want to embrace new ideas and ways of working, perhaps even more important in these new and difficult times. But for now, we have more than enough to consider as the main focus for us all is to plan the route to achieve a successful start to the new 2021/2022 season in September and support our netball community as much as we can. Thank you to all the committee members, league and club organisers; you continue to make such a tremendous contribution to netball in the county – remember, all volunteers themselves. This season has been a difficult one, but we can now all look forward. Enjoy the summer and see you in September for the start of a fantastic season.

# Performance AGM Report 2020/21 Season



The Performance Group has worked very hard during this COVID year to provide netball to the young players in our county. They managed to hold trials, outside and fully COVID compliant, for both the Satellite and County Academies during the October half term of 2020.

A few sessions took place before the December lockdown but it meant that we were ready to restart when England Netball gave the ok to do so. Virtual Strength & Conditioning sessions were arranged during lockdown.

I am very pleased to say that all the academies are now up and running and this year will run to mid-July.

The 4 Satellite Academies are being held at Harris Academy Mitcham, Nonsuch, Howard of Effingham and Guildford County School. They are using a combination of indoor and outdoor sessions to comply with COVID regulations.

The U13 squads have 12 weeks of training and then an internal Surrey tournament is being organized for the 4 academies on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> July to finish their season.

Each County Academy athlete attends training at Harris Academy Sutton and Strength & Conditioning at Advance Performance Gym (Merrist Wood). We have also entered 2 County teams into the Gems summer league so that the coaches can see the athletes perform under match conditions. This combination of activity seems to be working very well.

A match date was planned for Sunday the 16<sup>th</sup> May against Berkshire County but was cancelled due to bad weather, as it was due to be played outside. There will be a County tournament for our area on Sunday June 27<sup>th</sup> which Surrey Storm will attend as a pre- selection for the U15 School Sports Games being held on the 2-5 September.

Virtual meetings have been held with both Surrey Storm and London Pulse via the Performance Management Groups. England Netball has also been proactive post lockdown and are running online Performance ID Courses which 8 of out team are attending.

4 new coaches came on board this summer; one is currently doing her Level 2 Coaching Award using the new virtual training course.

Plans are currently being made for next season and we are in contact with both Surrey Storm and London Pulse regarding their trials and the School Sports Games which are going ahead on 2 – 5 September, COVID permitting!

We could not have done this without the fantastic support of the coaches who have risen to the task of getting the Surrey Academies up and running with such positive enthusiasm. A very special mention has to be made for Patricia Balcombe who has completed the mammoth administrative tasks which has enabled the activities to take place.

# Officiating AGM Report 2020/21 Season



In line with England Netball and Government guidance, all netball activity ceased in March 2020 due to Covid 19. During the lull, things did not stand still as England Netball were working behind the scenes to support members with the Virtual Netball Club.

Covid Officers were introduced so that Clubs could get up and running as soon as the go ahead was given by government. Modified Rules were authorised to help scaffold a move to "return to play" and Forums were delivered to Umpires on the Modified Rules, online by England Netball.

A Rules update has been made for the 2021 season effective 1<sup>st</sup> September 2021 and New Rules books have been issued by England Netball.

#### Written Paper- C Award.

Surrey County were lucky enough to be selected along with 2 other Counties nationally, to run an online pilot scheme for the C Award written paper. 10 applicants on the waiting list were offered the paper back in October and November 2020. We had 9 successful passes.

#### Courses

Covid 19 has meant that England Netball had to look at the way that courses were delivered and has seen them recently move to an online format for all Officiating courses. A new pathway has been updated on the Surrey website. Into Officiating Courses went live at the end of May 2021 and were quickly booked up. With further sessions due to be released in July.

C Award Courses will follow in June, quickly followed by B Award courses. The new pathway will see bookings made through the England Netball website, with payment directed through the Engage platform. All learners must hold a current England Netball membership. Learners will be able to access courses via an online format at a date convenient to themselves and will be delivered by tutors from anywhere in the country without the need to travel. The courses are theory based and learners will receive a resource pack prior to their attendance. The practical element of the courses will be picked up within County following attendance on a course. Learners will receive support through mentoring. The "Into Officiating" element of the pathway requires a short assessment before moving onto the C award course. Learners can practice on Back to Netball leagues and on Club training matches. The "C Award" course will include one sitting of the online Written paper. (to be taken up to 6 months after the course is attended) Learners can practice on local leagues depending on the individual league rules relating to Officials. Learners will need to keep a logbook of league matches umpired, as a part of their progression to C award Assessment. Assessments will be carried out on suitable matches within the County and arranged by the County Officiating Lead. (COL) previously known as the County Umpiring Secretary (CUS)

### **Beginner Umpires HUB**

To support New umpires in the transition to gaining Match practice a new HUB will be set up to support Beginners to gain confidence with their umpiring. Mentoring support and guidance will be given by England

Netball assessors to set learners on the right track. The HUB will be situated in Surrey and new learners attending the "Into Officiating "courses will be encouraged to attend for initial support.

#### Mentoring

As the move to online courses is now in place the need for Umpire mentors across the County is now paramount. The County need volunteers to support new umpires on their Officiating journey towards qualification. A mentoring course will be organised to support keen mentors. Contact COL for further details.

#### **B Award Written Paper**

Sittings for the B Award paper will take place in October, February and June. Applicants must have attended a B Award Course prior to sitting the paper and can be made through the COL. Mentoring can be offered for the paper.

Mentoring of C to B Award umpires continues on Surrey County league matches.

The New season is due to start in September 2021.

### Junior Leagues AGM Report 2020/21 Season



**Summary from the Junior Leagues** 

- 1. Surrey Junior Netball League NEW
- 2. Nonsuch Junior League

#### 1. Surrey Junior Netball League

The new Surrey Junior Netball League (SJNL) is now due to start in September 2021 The aim being to:

- Streamline the dates so that all clubs are playing in the same league on the same dates,
- To provide the junior netballers with more match opportunity (in line with other counties),
- Provide netball of a better standard for the stronger teams and an equal standard for the weaker teams
- Play longer matches to prepare girls for the transition to adult netball
- To prevent losing girls to hockey and football who play matches every weekend.

There are 21 Surrey Clubs with teams entered in to A, B and C divisions for age groups U10 - U16, approximately 210 teams signed up for the 2021/22 season. The venues are Manor House School (MHS)/Howard and Epsom College, and the U10s/11/15s and 16s will be at MHS/Howard with possibly the U16A playing indoors, and the U12s/13s/14s will be at Epsom College.

There will be 9 league dates across the season and on each league date the girls will play one match that will fit into an hours' time slot and expected to be 10 minutes quarters.

### 2. Nonsuch Junior League

It is expected that there will be 5 clubs that cannot commit to the new structure of the Surrey League and the restructured Nonsuch Junior League will ensure that those clubs have competitive match play. It has been agreed with the new Surrey League committee that clubs cannot play at Nonsuch if they have entered any teams into their league - Nonsuch will not be an overflow for the main league but an alternative league instead.

### Greenacres League AGM report 2020/21 Season



The decision was made, like other Leagues in Surrey and surrounding counties, to cease all activity in line with the Government and England Netball directives.

We maintained contact with the teams and encouraged the use of the online Virtual Netball Club.

During the lockdown, we made use of the time to review our activities taking into account feedback from the teams and took the decision to look for an alternative venue. This was a difficult task as facilities were not always available for the day, time, number of courts required and also took into consideration the location of the Croydon Netball League's activities and, out of courtesy, informed the Chairman of the move. We are an entry league for returners, 'Back to Netball' and 'Netball Now' on a social and competitive basis we felt we can continue operating in the same manner as that in Warlingham. We encourage progression to the Croydon League should players/teams and umpires wish to progress to a more competitive structure of play.

The League also sources umpires for matches and acts as a training environment for learner umpires under supervision.

We have successfully negotiated to with the new Coombe Wood School in Croydon to use one indoor and two outdoor courts, although the latter is now quite complete.

We held a meeting at Coombe Wood with all the current teams to advise them of the decision to move and the rationale and show them around the facilities. We appreciated we might naturally loose teams and some teams may find the distance just a bit too far. We are pleased to say that the majority are coming to the new venue and are looking forward to the unique set up. We are commencing with some friendly matches before the League restarts afresh in September.

We will have some vacant slots and will look to encourage new teams/players to join from the 'Back to Netball/Netball Now' environment and will be advertising by word of mouth and social media.

Along with the other Leagues everyone is looking forward to getting back to some form of normality from September and beyond.
